

SCHOOL UNIFORM / GROOMING - BOYS' UNIFORM

Winter: College grey trousers (no drill or Levi trousers)
Grey College socks (no football socks)
Black lace-up, polishable leather shoes with a heel. The shoe must cover the entire foot. (College approved – no boots, suede-type shoes)
Long-sleeve blue shirt
College tie
Blue College embroidered V-neck jumper
Black belt
College blazer (All students in Years 11 and 12 are encouraged to own a blazer)
Sky Blue/Navy Blue scarves are permitted
College Bucket Hat – sun protective hat for outdoor activities
College Beanie
Note: The tracksuit top can be worn over the jumper on cold days but is not to be worn in place of the jumper.

Summer: Grey College approved shorts
Grey College socks
Black leather shoes (College approved – no boots or suede-type shoes)
Blue shirt
Blue College embroidered V-neck jumper
College Bucket Hat - sun protective hat for outdoor activities

Sports: College approved tracksuit
Navy blue shorts with light blue side stripe (e.g. NSW Rugby League type)
Plain sky blue knit shirt with collar and College emblem
College football socks or white socks
Lace-up joggers, predominantly white
The College sun protective hat for all outdoor sport
Note: Football jerseys, basketball singlets, T-shirts (other than the College) and fluorescent shoelaces etc., are **NOT** permitted.

General Appearance:

Clean-shaven. Hair neat, tidy and of an acceptable style. Hair needs to be above the collar and out of the eyes. Haircuts should be no shorter than a Number 2.
Hair should be a consistent, natural colour that is acceptable to the Deputy Principal.
No coloured T-shirts or skivvies are to be visible if worn under shirts.
Blue or white T-shirts may be worn under shirts.
No facial piercing is allowed.

Jewellery:

Students may wear a single, simple neck chain, wristwatch, signet ring and sleepers or studs worn in the ear lobes only. Excess jewellery will be given to the main office who will put it in a labeled envelope and return it to the student at an appropriate time.

Sports Uniform

- **Thursday afternoon sport is compulsory for all Years 7 to 10 and voluntary for students in Years 11 and 12.**
- All students doing sport are to wear the College sports uniform for Thursday afternoon sport.
- Year 11 and 12 must have a sports uniform to represent the College.
- Students are only to wear sports uniform for sports excursions if instructed to do so. If this is the case, it must be correct sports uniform.

IF STUDENTS DO NOT HAVE CORRECT SPORTS UNIFORM TO WEAR THEY MUST WEAR FULL **SCHOOL UNIFORM** AND CHANGE FOR SPORT. AN 'OUT OF UNIFORM' NOTE IS **NOT** ACCEPTABLE IN THIS CASE.

Practical PE Lessons

- It is a requirement of the PE and PD/Health/PE Course to have practical lessons. Students will need to bring sports clothes for these.
- If students do not bring these clothes their PE teacher will place the student on a PE detention.
- Repeated failure to bring the required clothes, or failure to attend PE lessons will result in an 'Unsatisfactory Progress' letter being sent to parents/guardians. This will inform them that the student is liable to receive unsatisfactory grades or comments for PE on their school reports.
- The parents/guardians will be asked to seek an interview with the teacher; the PD/Health/PE Coordinator or the Curriculum Coordinator.
- If students use the pool during a PE or Sport lesson, they must change out of their wet clothes for the next class.

When Out of Uniform

For any variation to uniform, students should carry a note giving:

- a) Their name
- b) Date
- c) Reason for incorrect uniform
- d) The length of time they will be out of correct uniform
- e) Signature of parent/guardian/dorm supervisor

They should present this note to their Pastoral Care Teacher or House Coordinator, both of whom will sign, date, comment if necessary and hand the note back to the student. The student should show this note to any teacher who asks to see it. Every effort must be made to return to correct College uniform as quickly as possible.

Out of Uniform Days

Occasionally students will have the opportunity not to wear school uniform. This may be for a fundraising venture. The stipulations with these days are that **students MUST dress modestly and appropriately and wear enclosed shoes on these days:**

- It is a school day – students are not to dress as if they were going out to a party / disco etc.
- The clothing chosen by students must resemble the uniform in the area it covers – e.g. NO bare midriffs.
- Students will still be participating in normal class activities and their choice of dress must reflect this, including OH&S issues and therefore enclosed shoes must be worn.

Any students that Pastoral Care teachers or House Coordinators feel are not dressed appropriately will be sent to the front office. **Any student unable to meet these stipulations, are to wear full school uniform on the day.**
